LIFE (Learning In Faith Experiences – (Our Parish Faith Formation Program)
We arrive once again to the season of “Ordinary Time” in our liturgical year and we’re already veering off to celebrate a special day called a Solemnity - which calls our attention to the central mysteries of our faith. Today, on the first Sunday after Pentecost, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. This feast asks us to consider what we believe about God who reveals himself in the Trinity. How do we really attempt to make sense of or explain this mystery of our faith? There are many who struggle to answer that mystery of One God who is Three-In-One. We see and use many symbols attempting to explain and depict the Trinity: the shamrock, a triangle, three interlocking circles, the Celtic knot... but all of these attempts to give reason and definition all fall short of the power and beauty of The Trinity. In your faith life, have you ever imagined a depiction of The Trinity, different from those mentioned above? I have two thoughts/pictures/images that I hold in my heart that describe The Trinity for me. The first is a way of “imagining” rather than an image. I describe it as the relationship between the *Creator* (God) and the *Redeemer* (Jesus). It’s this free-flowing “loving exchange” between them that is the Spirit (*Sanctifier*). A second image for me, but this time more of a video clip of this love relationship of our Three-In-One God: Picture children (or adults) sitting on a merry-go-round. You see them each sitting in their own spots, but as the speed of the merry-go-round increases, the people rapidly blend one into the other until they’re a blurred union. The individuals, then the blurring of them together is symbolic of the loving relationship of our triune God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Jesus tells us in today’s gospel to “Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit, teaching them all that I have commanded you. Behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age.” As Christians, we have been baptized and claim the cross of Jesus as our mark of identity – and we sign ourselves with the Sign of the Cross, proclaiming our belief in our God: Father, Son, and Spirit. When you bless yourself with the mark of our spiritual identity – the Sign of the Cross, is your movement done out of habit and just ritual, or are your motions and words a proclamation of your belief in God whom you are called to serve by virtue of your baptism?
