LIFE (Learning In Faith Experiences)

As much as I want to be updated on the effects of Hurricane Harvey, at the same time, I don't want to watch the horrifying scenes of how

Harvey is unfolding and actually affecting the lives of so many people. Harvey has been wreaking havoc for (as of today) six straight days in virtually the same region, and is now making its second landfall in Louisiana - on the 12th Anniversary of Hurricane Katrina. At least Harvey is sparing the people of New Orleans. Thousands upon thousands of people have been rescued from their homes, an estimated 30,000+ people will be temporarily homeless afterwards. With up-to-the-minute scenes of such massive devastation and destruction available to us on social and news media, the feelings and thoughts that come from such a horrific event like this is and can be overwhelming, but there is ONE THING that I am amazed at in all of this bleakness: God's presence! In the depressing and heartbreaking stories by news reporters, they are finding and naming stories of hope – even calling news segments "Strangers helping strangers and neighbors helping neighbors." The following are some statements made by people who'd had to leave everything behind, getting out with not much more than the clothes on their backs, some having had to wait many anxious and fear-filled hours until being rescued. "We prayed a lot. We just praised God and we were rescued, so we're very thankful." "God is good, we are blessed!" "I'm just so grateful!" "I've got my babies, I love you so much! Thank you, and Thank you God!" God is present...people with boats came out and are first-responders, neighbors are helping one another and living in the same spaces, the human capacity to love and care for another is being lived out, and in the words of a young man who went to Texas to offer his help: "We're not leaving our brothers behind." There are many ways that we, too, can help those persons whose lives have been forever changed by Hurricane Harvey - I'm reminded of the words of the song St. Teresa's Prayer (John Michael Talbot). Christ has no body now but yours, no hands, no feet on earth, but yours. Yours are the eyes through which He looks compassion on this world. Yours are the feet with which He walks to do good. Yours are the hands with which He blesses all the world. Yours are the hands, yours are the feet, yours are the eyes, you are His body. Christ has no body now on earth, but yours. On Tuesday night in the Houston area, a sign of hope emerged: the sun, not seen for days, broke through the clouds! May our thoughts, prayers, and Christ-like actions continue to actively be with our "distant friends" who will forever feel the effects and after-effects of Harvey in their lives.
