This call may have been through the invitation of the pastor, a Faith Formation Coordinator or Staff person, or through the role of being a teacher by profession. However each “yes” to serve in this catechetical ministry came about, know that this calling ultimately comes from God whose Holy Spirit inspires and guides you – Catechists in our programs of **LIFE**, Sacramental Preparation classes, and Children’s Liturgy of the Word.
